Abstracts

One manuscript should be submitted by the due date as indicated in the call for papers via the submission procedure specified in the call. Only original work will be accepted. All abstracts should be submitted in English. The abstract should be at least 150 words, and not exceed 300 words, and include exactly one figure. Composite figures are accepted. Abstracts should be submitted in the linked dropbox folder in Word or PDF format. They should clearly summarize the content and highlights of the poster. Co-authorship is allowed but the student must be the first author and presenter. The criteria for assessment include originality, significance of the results, and quality of presentation. The winner of the award is selected based on the combined evaluation of the written text and poster presentation either in the poster session, or in a lightning talk session. The Campbell Scientific Award, along with a \$1000 prize, will be awarded at the CGU Banquet/Luncheon.

Text

Abstracts should be single spaced, using 12-point font, with wide (1 inch) margins. Footnotes must not be used. Authors should write concisely. Authors' names and page numbers should be written on all sheets of the manuscript.

Title

The title should be brief, and the author's name should be typed on the line below the title; the affiliation and address should follow on the next line. In the case of co-authors, respective addresses should be clearly indicated. Correspondence will be sent to the first-named author, who must also be the student applicant.

Illustrations, Figures and Tables

The submission must include exactly one figure (composite figures are accepted). Figure must be of high resolution.
